# A history of the New Albany Rotary Club

The first Rotary club in the world was organized in Chicago, Illinois, U.S.A., on 23 February, 1905, by Paul P. Harris, a young lawyer, who gathered together in a spirit of friendship and understanding a group of men, each of whom was engaged in a different form of service to the public.

That basis of membership one man from each business and profession in the community still exists in Rotary. At first, the members of the new club met in rotation at the various places of business of the members, and this suggested the name "Rotary."

Aberdeen, Mississippi was  $_{\mathrm{the}}$ first club in North Mississippi and was organized in 1921. A charter member of the Aberdeen club, Mr. Sykes, father of Mrs. J. Frank Hall of New Albany (Dorothy Sykes). encouraged the organization of a club in New Albany and the Aberdeen club sponsored the New Albany club, which became the Number 2 club.

The Rotary Club of New Albany, Mississippi, was organized on January 21, 1924 and was elected to membership in International Rotary on February 26, 1924, with the formal charter #1,643 issued on that date

Albany and Ripley then organized the Corinth Club in 1936 and the Booneville Club in 1937.

New Albany Rotary initiated negotiations which led to the establishment of the first garment plant in New Albany, the old Ferguson-McKinney Co., out of which grew the Tupelo Garment Co. and still later the Schwabe Irwin B. Manufacturing Co. and associated plants.

New Albany Rotary Club encouraged the organization of New Albany's second oldest club, the Kiwanis Club, since it was felt that because of the classification system used by Rotary, an additional service club was definitely needed in New Albany.

Later the Rotary and Kiwanis Clubs were instrumental in the construction of an indoor basketball court or gymnasium. In appreciation the school board named the structure the Ki-Ro Gym, and it served the school well for many years.

Rotary furnished substantial leadership all down the years for nearly every movement for the constructive good of the city and county, co-operating with other civic, educational or religious groups. One such promotion was the highly successful Rural Community Development Councils, commonly known as "RCDC.

According to the late W. 0. Rutledge, long-time publisher of the New Albany Gazette, "Much of the early life of New Albany Rotary Club revolved around the old Rainey Hotel and particularly the main dining room which was renowned far and wide for its good country style food." "Uncle Bill" and his wife "Miss Laura" were the operators and they prided themselves on their fried chicken, steaks and, above all, country ham, red-eye gravy and biscuits.

Rotarians ate for a dollar a plate with seconds if you wished and for years they were faithfully served by the late Albert Sanders, who sold a little "corn" and later "legal booze" on the side, and his assistant waiter,

escorts of members dressed up in their long dresses and kid gloves and flowing capes to show off their splendor and eat a sumptuous meal in the Rainey dining room and hear a guest speaker, which one wife described as "dull as all getout."

New Albany Rotary Club met at the Rainey until sometime during WWII when they moved to Cliff Wells' Place on Cleveland Street near what is now Mattie Thompson School. Next they went out to what was then Beacon Hill Cafe.

From there they moved downtown again to the second floor of the late Charlie Marbury's Whiteway Restaurant. Then on to Southland Motel Restaurant, Geneva's Lizard Thicket Restaurant, and presently to Oaks Country Club's Dining Room.

All the while the dollar-aplate charge was gradually on the increase minus the country ham and other choice delicacies.

One of the major early undertakings of the New Albany Rotary Club was the joint sponsorship, along with clubs of the District, in getting the Memphis Crippled Adult Hospital in operation, and supporting it generously until its shutdown when all the crippled adults in the area of its operation who were eligible for treatment and or care had been rehabilitated or were being seen after under various state or federal programs."

After the discontinuance of the hospital, the Rotary clubs began support of the Kidney Dialysis program and helped many patients by providing dialysis equipment for centrally located units, our nearest being in Tupelo.

At one of the club meetings a few years ago, Walt Harrison shared an idea he had gotten while making up attendance with the Gatlingburg Rotary Club.

Each week the members were given the opportunity to stand and relate a particularly happy moment or occasion that had happened in their family in the

were very proud and happy about. After telling about their happy moment they donated (whatever amount they wished) to a fund that was accumulated and used to try to help make someone else happy.

This club voted immediately to adopt this plan and to date many thousands of dollars have been contributed to the Sharing at Christmas Program.

During the 1998 club year N.A. Rotary donated \$3,000.00 to a fund to help correct a very young school-age child's teeth so that the child could talk and feel good about himself.

With a keen interest in education and the school system, the club has donated in excess of \$13,000 to the Endowment for Excellence in Education fund as well as furnishing volunteers to man the annual fish fry event.

Additionally, each year the N. A. Rotary club sponsors several youth to the Rotary Leadership Conference, an intensive training program for our leaders of tomorrow.

One member of the club, the late W. T. Lowery, set a record of 35 years of Perfect Attendance.

The club has been fortunate to have had fine and genuine fellowship all through the years of its existence with programs presented by some of the nation's outstanding personalities, giving emphasis to the objectives of Rotary, to club service, vocational service, community service and international service.

These are concrete benefits, but not to be overlooked, has been the service rendered by the club in developing and cementing friendship among its members and other citizens that would never otherwise have been possible. The fine spirit of unity and good-fellowship has contributed largely to its success

## **Rotarian and U.S. Senator Thad Cochran to be keynote speaker**

Thad Cochran is the senior United States Senator from the State of Mississippi.

When he was elected to the Senate in 1978, he became the first Republican to be elected to a statewide office in Mississippi. He has been reelected with landslide margins three times, and he was unopposed in the 1990 election. For twelve years he served as an elected member of the Senate Republican leadership.

He is Chairman of the Senate Subcommittee for Agriculture Appropriations. He also chairs the Subcommittee on International Security, Proliferation, and Federal Services.

He serves on the Board of Visitors of the U.S. Naval Academy and the Board of Regents of the Smithsonian Institution. He is also a member of the Agriculture, Nutrition and Forestry Committee and the Rules Committee of the Senate.

Before going to Washington in 1973 to serve in the U.S. House of Representatives, Senator Cochran practiced law in Jackson, and he served as an officer in the U.S. Navy.

He was born in Pontotoc, Mississippi, was educated in the public schools of the State and earned his college and law degrees from the University of Mississippi. He studied international law for a year under a Rotary Foundation Fellowship at Trinity College Dublin, Ireland.

He has been awarded honorary degrees from Mississippi College, Kentucky Wesleyan College, Blue Mountain College and the University of Richmond.

He and his wife, the former Rose Clayton of New Albany, Mississippi, have two children, Clayton and Kate.
